In the current emergency, Ukrainians have the right to live in the EU and to access essential services such as housing and medical care. Ukrainians also have the right to continue and access education and training, and to look for work. To support such access, Ukrainians need to have their skills, qualifications and study periods completed in Ukraine recognised, while organisations and companies in the EU need to understand Ukraine's education and training system and qualifications. This page provides key information about Ukraine's education system, guidance in understanding and recognising all types of Ukrainian qualifications, recognising study periods, and guiding Ukrainians to education, learning and employment opportunities. 

 - Identifying technology transfer needs and research capacity gaps presented by the SMEs in the Agrifood domain in the Western Balkans.
 - Identifying the expertise and research capacity of VET systems in the Agri-food domain in the Western Balkans.
 - Prepare VET centres and schools to participate in the Horizon Europe and new funding instruments from the Interregional Innovation Investments.
 - Providing opportunities for capacity building in partnership with European VET centres leading technology transfer and applied research
